7. OLD BUSINESS

A. Resignations

Mr. Santogatta informed the Board of the following resignations: **Susan Leigh**, JV Girls' Softball Coach at Terryville High School effective February 26, 2013 and **Stephanie Fletcher**, Special Education Teacher at Harry S. Fisher Elementary School effective June 30, 2013.

B. Addendum to Agreement for Child Nutrition Programs (ED-099)

Public Act 06-63, An Act concerning Healthy Food and Beverages in Schools, requires that all Connecticut Public School Districts that are eligible to participate in the healthy food certification take action to certify whether all food items sold to students will or will not meet Connecticut Nutritional Standards.

MOTION: In accordance with Public Act 06-63 of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Plymouth Board of Education hereby authorizes the Chairperson of the Board to execute the Addendum to Agreement for Child Nutrition Programs (ED-099) and to execute any claims for reimbursement. Motion **Mr. Santorso**, seconded **Mr. Gentile**, motion passed unanimously.

Certification Statement

MOTION: Pursuant to section 10-215f of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Plymouth Board of Education, hereby certifies that all food items offered for sale to students in the school(s) under its jurisdiction, and not exempted from the Connecticut Nutrition Standards published by the Connecticut State Department of Education will meet said standards during the period of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. Such certification shall include all food offered for sale to students separately from reimbursable meals at all times and from all sources, including but not limited to school stores, vending machines, school cafeterias, and any fundraising activities on school premises, whether or not school sponsored. Motion Mr. Bourbonniere, seconded Mr. Engle, motion passed unanimously.

Exemption Statement

MOTION: Pursuant to section 10-215f of the Plymouth Board of Education hereby acknowledges that the Board of Education or governing authority will exclude from certification food items that do not meet the Connecticut Nutrition Standards, provided that (1) such food is sold in connection with an event occurring after the end of the regular school day or on the weekend, (2) such sale is at the location of the event, and (3) such food is not sold from a vending machine or school store. Motion Mr. Wetzel, seconded Mr. Santorso, motion passed unanimously.

Amendment to Agreement for Child Nutrition Programs (ED-099)

MOTION: Pursuant to section 10-215f of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Agreement for Child Nutrition Programs (ED-099) with the Plymouth Board of Education is hereby amended to include the above certification statement of compliance with the Connecticut Nutrition Standards and application for funding related to those standards. This addendum covers the period from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. Motion **Mr. Orsini**, seconded **Mr. Engle**, motion passed unanimously.

The Curriculum Subcommittee met on March 6, 2013. The following items were addressed: The Elementary DRA2 Results for winter – Ms. Holleran, Instructional Support Specialist, presented a cohort comparison on DRA2 reading results for May 2012, September 2012 and January 2013 with the overall trend showing summer loss in each grade level and progress from fall to winter. A more detailed analysis was presented using Inform, an on-line system used by teachers to gather data, shared some of the interventions that the schools are using with at risk readers, i.e. LLI Kids and Reading a-z Kids and how the data is used to regroup students into level intervention groups.

A new dishwasher will be purchased for Harry S. Fisher Elementary School to replace a 20+ year one that has since broken down.

10. <u>ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS/REQUESTS/INFORMATION</u>

Dr. Tenney, Director of Curriculum & Instruction

Dr. Tenney reported on the following: The district is midway between CMT and CAPT Testing; Schools will be piloting the Smart Balanced Assessments which are all on line and are being done in preparation for the new assessments that will begin in 2014 & 2015; Teacher Evaluation Committee is in the process of preparing

a draft of the new teacher evaluation plan and should be presented sometime in June; exploring integrating writers workshop in the elementary schools; and reapplying for the Drug Free Communities Grant which is due at the end of March.

Mr. Trudeau, Director of Technology

Mr. Trudeau reported on the following: thank you to tonight's crew, Jeff, Matt, Jason and Mr. Maslak; on-line testing; the growing of mobile devices; and the technology department is operating at peak levels between the school district and the town.

Mr. Berube: Question: What is meant by peak levels?
Mr. Trudeau: Answer: The using of a help desk system. Each technology individual has a task every minute of the day whether those individuals(s) are at Water Pollution Control, the high school or the Board of Education.

Question: Mr. Berube - Do we have tech people solving the town problems? Answer: Mr. Trudeau - Yes

Question: Mr. Berube - Do you know who pays those techs? Answer: Mr. Santogatta – The district has a financial arrangement with the town. A technology position was added, presented to the Board last June and is funded by the town.

Mr. Parenti – Director of Pupil Personnel

Mr. Parenti reported on the following: Districts are now required to input on a data warehousing system all restraint seclusion data going back to July of 2012; looking at projecting enrollment for next year, staffing needs and the extended school year program for students in order to maximize dollars; and assisting Dr. Tenney with CMT and CAPT for special education students.

Question: Mr. Engle - On the extended summer school program, how many districts have been invited to defray costs?

Answer: Mr. Parenti – Thomaston because of the bus contract. The goal is to begin after July 1 since transportation between the 2 towns will be free. Ed Connection has also been contacted regarding putting together a more comprehensive special education program for districts in the area where they would cover transportation.

Question: Mr. Bourbonniere – Program at the high school with respect to the school store.

Answer: Mr. Parenti - Students are doing phenomenal at the school store which has a website; students from the high school are going to Fisher to help with the mail, etc. and hoping to expand the program to include Thomaston and Wolcott.

Mr. Santogatta, Business Manager

Mr. Santogatta reported: The Finance Subcommittee met prior to the Board Meeting and reviewed the accounts by facilities report for February. The Budget was approved and will be forwarded to the Town of Plymouth Board of Finance on Friday, March 15th.
