A. <u>2013 – 2014 School Calendar</u>

The Board Members were presented draft copies the 2013–2014 School Calendar with recommended adjustments in their packet. These adjustments will be necessary to coordinate calendars with Thomaston, Wolcott and our district. The changes are as follows:

August 28School beginsFebruary 14 & 17February BreakJune 9Last Day of School (provided no emergency closing days)

The adjustments to the calendar coordinate the busing for the 3 districts which result in cost savings for all 3 districts. Approval of the adjusted calendar will be made at the January Board Meeting.

# B. Bus Contracts

Prior to the Board Meeting, the Finance Subcommittee met and discussed the costs associated with busing for the next 5 years. After a brief discussion, the Finance Subcommittee made the following recommendation to the full Board.

MOTION: To award **Worhunsky Bus Company** a 5 year contract for regular education and in-house special education busing and to award **Cardinal Bus Company** a 5 year contract for special education out-of-district busing. Motion **Raymond Engle**, seconded **Gerard Bourbonniere**. The Chair asked for a roll vote, **Karen Kulesa**, **Gerard Bourbonniere**, **Martin Wetzel**, **Daniel Santorso**, **Daniel Gentile**, **Anthony Orsini** and the **Chair** all voted in favor of the motion. **Mark Berube** abstained. The vote was **8** for with **1** abstention. Motion passed.
